#### **HYMN NOTES:**

The three hymns we sing today are appropriate for Epiphany Day (January 6). "We Three Kings" was written—both words and music—in 1857 by John Henry Hopkins (1820-1891) who after a career as a reporter and tutor, became an Episcopal priest with interests in music. This Epiphany hymn is based on the visit of the Wise Men (Matthew 2:1-11) and is the first modern American Christmas carol. He wrote it with the intention of three male soloists singing the stanzas with the congregation singing the refrain.

Hopkins was born in Pittsburgh PA and became the first professor of church music at General Theological Seminary. In addition, he designed stained-glass windows and Episcopal seals and forms.
