Kirkin' o' the Tartan

Northwood Presbyterian Church Sunday, February 21, 2021 Livestreamed

Kirkin' o'the Tartans will be celebrated again this year on the third Sunday in February. This, now annual tradition here, will feature music for the bagpipes and representative tartans of Scottish clans as well as hymns and music of our Scottish heritage.

The service, although a modern invention, reminds us that in 1745, Scottish clansmen were forbidden by the British Crown to wear the tartan, and to play the bagpipes, and to acknowledge in any way their traditional clans. This prompted the stubborn Scots to secretly carry with them a piece of their tartans in their pockets as they went to church (kirk). On an appointed Sunday, the minister would slip into the service a blessing or "kirkin" for the tartans and clans which the tartans represented.

Our Kirkin' will be a celebration of the Scottish reformers as well as all those who have gone before us in the faith.

Annual Congregational Meeting to be Rescheduled

The Session has postponed the January 31st Annual Meeting of the Congregation, (which was set to take place automatically annually on the last Sunday in January by our Church By-Laws), and will reschedule it in the near future utilizing a computer online platform for video conferencing. The new date and information on how to attend and vote online will be provided for members of Northwood well in advance of the rescheduled meeting. The business of the meeting will be limited to electing new officers, (elders and deacons), and to vote on the Terms of Call for our pastors as required by The Book of Order of the Presbyterian Church (USA).

Special \$300 Tax Deduction

The Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act, includes a temporary special \$300 deduction designed for people who choose to take the standard deduction. This deduction lowers both adjusted gross income and taxable income for those making donations to organizations like Northwood and translates into tax savings for the donor. Be sure to consult your tax preparer to see how this new deduction might benefit you.

Kids' Corner Preschool & Northwood Child Care

Covid-19 has been an odd time for all preschool centers but Kids' Corner Preschool & Northwood Child Care are doing well. We are starting to get registration ready for next year already.

I was hired as Director in October and have worked in childcare all my adult life. I have hired 2 new staff members, one two-year-old teacher and the other for afterschool care with Carissa who stepped down from being the two-year -old teacher because of school commitments.

The teachers have started a fundraising program called Artsonia. This program is the world's largest collection of student art published by teachers and students from around the world. Parents and families can view the art online, leave comments and order keepsakes featuring the artwork of which we get a percentage.

I have been blessed with a wonderful staff including new hires in the past few months. I love to hear the laughing and happiness that comes from every classroom.

PW News: Life Membership Award



Women of today have a voice in the P.C.(USA) but it was not always so. Two hundred years ago women had no role outside the home. But despite the restrictions, Presbyterian Women gained respect through their support of missionaries in the field. Their concerns were expressed with practical donations that were sorely needed and appreciated. First viewed as a Missionary Society in the turbulent 19th and early 20th centuries, they emerged as leaders and took their places of leadership alongside the men and our denomination is stronger for it.

The national organization of Presbyterian Women recognizes those who embody the qualities expressed in the PW Purpose with the awarding of a Lifetime Membership. In the past this has been conferred upon one or two persons [at Northwood Presbyterian]. However, since 2020 has been such an unusually challenging time, the committee chooses to honor, not one or two, but many for their voluntary service to Northwood and the community. It is done quietly, often behind the scenes without recognition or praise. They are the "Unsung Heroines" we honor today.

These women have worked in our office, cooked and delivered countless meals, volunteered in our schools, readied the sanctuary, managed our food pantry, cleaned the kitchen and sanctuary, chaperoned our youth and children, served as elders and deacons, worked as ushers and greeters, led Bible studies, chaired committees, folded and stuffed our publications, participated in choirs and handbell groups, collected for and ministered to the needy, etc.

Their innumerable hours in keeping our church a vibrant and beautiful place, especially during the pandemic, often go unnoticed and unpraised. Yet without each "heroine" there would be no Northwood as we all know and love it. These volunteers contribute both individually and collectively, and do their work quietly and wholly for the Glory of God.

Presbyterian Women are proud to recognize and celebrate these Unsung Heroines who are truly role models to be emulated.

We are collecting canned food for Beth-El for all of February—up to our mission trip. Please bring non-perishable items to the youth group with you so that we can bring them on our mission trip!

Our college group meets via Zoom for now, with in person opportunities every break. We plan to get together this summer a few times for mission and fellowship. We have so many high school graduates this year and we are devoted to providing a space for them to remain connected to their church during and after this new transition in their lives. Let's keep our class of 2020 in our prayers as they navigate through this new adventure in this unexpected way.

We will be taking a small group of students to Cedarkirk from Sunday afternoon March 14th, to Wednesday evening March 17th. Our Mini Mission will be filled with a variety of mission projects at Beth-El Farmworkers Ministry like working in the food pantry, working outside on light construction projects, gardening, and other various facility projects.
