# **Access Church Directory and Give via Android or iPhone**

Northwood uses ACS software and we'd like for you to know about the ACS Church Life<sup>TM</sup> mobile app. Those of us on staff have been using the app for a couple of years now and if you've given us the chance, we've probably downloaded it to your smartphone for you. The app provides instant access to the names, addresses, pictures and phone numbers of anyone who would normally appear in a printed Northwood church directory. Information is always as current as the church's data base and access is available to you anytime, anywhere, from your mobile phone. You can even map visits or sign up for events like Vacation Bible School all on the go. Also, with the new mobile giving feature, you can quickly and easily contribute to NPC's published funds...with just one click.

This easy-to-use app is free and available to all NPC members listed in our database using the same user



name and password that you create for Access ACS<sup>TM</sup>. If you don't already have a login and password, you can create one by visiting our website at www.northwoodpc.org and clicking on the LOGIN link at the top of the page. When the screen appears, just click where is says "Need a login?" Follow the steps to create the login and then visit the app store on your mobile device to search for and download the app called ACS Church Life. Once downloaded, tap on the new icon on your phone and login using the credentials you created via the website. It may sound a bit complicated if you aren't used to this exercise, but we're always available to help. Call Emily Cantin in the church office and arrange a time to come by. We'll get you started!

# What's the purpose of Ash Wednesday?

It marks first day of the 40 days of Lent, a roughly six-week period (not including Sundays) dedicated to reflection, prayer and fasting in preparation for Easter. It ends on Holy Thursday, the fifth day of Holy Week (the week leading up to Easter) that marks the Last Supper.

# What do the ashes mean?

The ashes, applied in the shape of a cross, are a symbol of penance, mourning and mortality.

# **Kids' Corner Preschool News**

The Kids' Corner Garden—On our playground, we have a small garden to help teach outside the classroom. In the fall, the kids have helped us plant many seeds, including pumpkin, cherry tomatoes, Campari tomatoes, sun flowers, zinnias, and marigolds. The kids are excited to see the seeds sprout and to water the plant as it grows. Several of the kids have picked and tried the cherry tomatoes off the vine! We will be planting again in the spring.

We also have milk weed in our garden. Monarch butterflies lay their eggs on milk weed and when they hatch, the caterpillars eat the leaves for days. The kids love to hunt for caterpillar sightings in our garden. When the caterpillar gets big enough, we will place him in an observation tent to observe the caterpillar in the chrysalis state. Once the butterfly hatches, the class releases it so that the process can begin again! Gardening introduces where food comes from, how to take care of living creatures, and the beauty of God's creations.

# Gifts of Women Sunday


