

From the PASTOR'S DESK

"The Sacraments – We Have Only Two"

This is my third article about being Presbyterian. The bulk of this article is a short answer on what we believe about the sacraments. I begin by reminding you that these articles are written based on the estimate that 58 percent of all members of the Presbyterian Church (USA), the denomination to which we belong, did not grow up "Presbyterian." I believe this is a natural, good and positive thing to be so diverse in this day and time. We will never be uniform in belief, although a few may want to demand this, but we are joyfully united together by faith in Jesus Christ. I believe the church in our day is about difficult conversations, not our demands, and I believe this will be the case for some years to come. I also believe we reflect the diversity and the discussions about the practice of faith present in the New Testament Church we read about in the Bible.

The Presbyterian denomination is becoming more and more diverse. If you haven't noticed in the last decade or so our denomination is not making "top down" decisions about what we are to believe as particular churches. While we still agree with theological essentials with the wider church in our interpretation of the Bible and Book of Confessions, like the sacraments and the importance of Jesus Christ as our only Savior and Lord, in other matters of life and faith, local options are now offered in one part of our church constitution, the Book of Order. It seems that the denomination, through the voting of all its presbyteries, will soon allow each church and pastor to have a local option about Christian marriage. So remember you heard it first here before an optional definition of Christian marriage is adopted by the PC(USA). Traditional marriage between a man and a woman is still affirmed but there will be options for churches who wish, without penalty, to conduct marriage between two people if the current amendment is approved.

The Sacraments (Presbyterians hold to two sacraments and marriage is not one of them)

Both the Sacraments of Baptism and the Lord's Supper are God's acts of sealing the promises of faith within the community of faith as the congregation worships.

The Sacrament of Baptism: At Northwood Presbyterian Church the Sacrament of Baptism is offered to all who wish to confess their faith in Jesus Christ and to the children of those who profess faith in Christ. If you would like more information about having yourself or your child(ren) baptized, please contact me or Paul Means. Here is the Presbyterian understanding of what the Sacrament of Baptism means, as found in our [Book of Order](#).

Baptism is the sign and seal of incorporation into Christ. In Baptism, we participate in Jesus' death and resurrection. In Baptism, we die to what separates us from God and are raised to newness of life in Christ. Baptism is the sign and symbol of inclusion in God's grace and covenant with the Church. Both believers and their children are included in God's covenant love. Children of believers are to be baptized without undue delay, but without undue haste. The Baptism of children witnesses to the truth that God's love claims people before they are able to respond in faith. The Baptism of those who enter the covenant upon their own profession of faith witnesses to the truth that God's gift of grace calls for fulfillment in a response of faithfulness.


Baptism is received only once. The Presbyterian Church USA recognizes all Baptisms with water in the name of the Father, of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit administered by other Christian churches. Baptism is celebrated in a service of public worship, ordinarily during a Sunday Lord's Day service of worship. The water used for Baptism should be common to the location.

The Sacrament of the Lord Supper: At Northwood we generally celebrate the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper on the 1st Sunday of each month, except when Maundy Thursday falls close to the first Sunday of the month at Easter. We also celebrate communion at special services throughout the year. Here is the Presbyterian understanding of the meaning of the Lord's Supper as explained in the [Book of Order](#).

The Lord's Supper is the sign and seal of eating and drinking in communion with the crucified and risen Lord. In His last meal before his death, Jesus took and shared with His disciples the bread and wine, speaking of them as His body and blood, signs of the new covenant. Around the Table of the Lord, God's people are in communion with Christ and with all who belong to Christ. All who are baptized are to be welcomed to the Table. In the life of the worshipping congregation, Word and Sacrament have an integral relationship. Whenever the Lord's Supper is observed, it shall be preceded by the reading and the proclamation of the Word. The Lord's Supper is to be observed on the Lord's Day, in the regular place of worship. It is to be celebrated regularly and frequently enough to be recognized as integral to the Service for the Lord's Day. Special observances of the sacrament of the Lord's Supper are to be approved by the Session, administered by a minister of Word and Sacrament, and must be open to the whole believing community.

This is just a short answer about the sacraments of Baptism and the Lord's Supper. Please know I'm open to discussion with anyone, as I know Paul Means is, to discussing any of issues I've mentioned in this article.
