

Pastor Paul's Sabbatical Celebrating God in the Beauty, Majesty and Wildness of God's Creation

It seems amazing that it has already been six years since Pam, Colin, Christopher and I moved to Clearwater. It is with joy that I give thanks to God for the opportunity to serve this community of faith as Associate Pastor of Congregational Care and Mission.

As I celebrate my six years here with you, I am deeply grateful to this church family for the opportunity to have a one-month sabbatical in July of this year. This will be a time of personal renewal to reflect on the beauty, truth and goodness of God. This sabbatical will also allow me time to explore and work on a theme that has continually nourished my faith and renewed my spirit - Celebrating God in the Beauty, Majesty and Wildness of God's Creation.

My prayer is that this sabbatical will not only be a blessing to me, but will also be a blessing and provide a benefit for the congregation of Northwood. Toward that end, I will be using Scripture, spiritual reflections and photography to develop a 4-week series and an accompanying 31-day devotional based on the theme mentioned above. Then from Jasper National Park, I will cross back over into the United States and travel to Washington State and spend time in Olympic National Park, Mount St. Helens and Mount Rainier. The last week of July will be spent working on the 4-week series and the daily devotional.

Please know that I greatly value your prayers as I plan and prepare for this wonderful gift to explore God's creation and to experience God's presence in what I am sure will be surprising, grace-filled ways.

From the PASTOR'S DESK

Christian Marriage at Northwood Presbyterian Church

(As published in the 3-27-15 Monitor)

Dear Church Members and Friends of Northwood,

Since the early days of those seeking to follow Jesus as recorded in the New Testament, individual people of faith, for one reason or another, have had differences of opinion in specific matters of life and faith. When we do hold to different positions, such as on the definition of Christian marriage, it is time once again to remember that the Sacraments of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ unite us. We are one in Baptism and at the Lord's Table; so as a congregation we affirm together that, "We are one in Jesus Christ!"

What does the new marriage amendment by the denomination now mean for us as a local church?

This past month your Church's Session, the local governing body of each congregation in our denomination, by unanimous consent agreed to continue our current position and policy on Christian marriage at Northwood (see this position statement at the end of my letter).

Patrice Hatley, Coach and Coordinator of Tampa Bay Presbytery, the geographical district of churches to which we belong, has written the following to congregations in our presbytery in response to the new denominational amendment:

This is no ordinary time for us as a church seeking God's perfect wisdom about many things. May we resist distraction from our charge to make new and mature disciples for Jesus Christ. This is the great commission and we should push on because that IS THE PRIZE, friends. I believe the Holy Spirit is not done with us yet. Be committed to the church for the long haul, and believe that there is more truth than any of us possess. I encourage you to get out your Bibles right now and read the Apostle's letter to the Ephesians where, in chapter 4, he admonished the believers to 'make every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace.'

Some in our congregations are disappointed in the passage of the amendment and others are happy with it. Others have no strong opinion at all. There has not been and will not be a requirement to perform wedding ceremonies for couples which the minister discerns are not appropriate. There is now no prohibition to perform same gender marriage and there is no requirement to perform them, either. The amendment does nothing to change the right of a teaching elder to decline to perform a marriage which the teaching elder believes not to be blessed by God. Likewise, the session retains full authority as to what worship services it will approve to be held in the church's facilities.

Patrice's letter is a good letter and I wanted to share it with you. Please know I'm open to having conversation with anyone on this issue or others.

Christian marriage is a covenant through which a man and a woman are called to live out together before God their lives of discipleship. In a service of Christian marriage a lifelong commitment is made by a woman and a man to each other, publically witnessed and acknowledged by the community of faith.

Christian marriage should be celebrated in the place where the community gathers for worship. As a service of Christian worship, the marriage service is under the direction of the Minister(s) of Word and Sacrament at Northwood and the supervision of the Session.
