


Cedarkirk Summer Camp

Experiencing God Class Sundays at 11:00 AM




Sunday Evening Bible Study "Hebrews"

Introducing City Night



City Night is a Youth Worship Event that started on March 4th and will continue until the end of May. Youth and volunteers meet each Monday at 7pm in the Sanctuary where our youth lead worship. After worship, they sit with their peers in the pews and get a Bible lesson. We're doing this really cool thing where we're walking through the entire Bible from cover to cover and we're currently studying Leviticus. Each week the youth grab our Bibles, learn a new section of the book, and really dig in as they look at history and do word studies so they can understand the context. After the worship service, the youth split up into small groups, eat pizza, ask questions, and talk about how the story applies to their own personal lives so they can get a better understanding of God and His expectations of them. After small groups, everyone comes together again to play games and hang out until it's time to go home at 9:00pm.
