# Kirkin' o' the Tartan


Northwood Presbyterian Church

 anthems of our Scottish heritage.



In 1745, Scottish clansmen were forbidden by the British Crown to wear the tartans, and to play the bagpipes, and to acknowledge in any way their traditional clans. This prompted the stubborn Scots to secretly carry with them a piece of their tartans in their pockets as they went to church (kirk). On an appointed Sunday, the minister would slip into the service a blessing, or "kirkin" for the tartans and clans which the tartans represented. Our Kirkin' will be a celebration of the Scottish reformers as well as all those who have gone before us in the faith.

Dear Church Family and Friends,

I want to share with you a story and a truth for us to remember in this new year of 2020.

The story is about a man who moved into a retirement community. It wasn't long until he had made a number of friends and there was one lady he was especially attracted to and she was attracted to him. Finally, one evening he proposed, asking her to marry him. The next morning he woke up remembering his proposal, but he couldn't remember her answer. So, he went to her & said, "I'm really embarrassed. I proposed to you last night but I can't remember if you said 'Yes' or 'No.'" "Oh, thank goodness!" she replied. "I remembered saying 'yes' but I couldn't remember who asked me."

Sometimes I feel that way about New Year's resolutions. I tell myself, "This year I'm going to do all kinds of things to improve myself. But then somehow, over time, I forget. Maybe you have that problem, too. So, let me suggest a truth that came to us long ago for us to remember.

First, remember that, January 6<sup>th</sup> is the 12th day of Christmas. It is named Epiphany. Epiphany means an "appearing" of something. The word bears the idea that something that was once private and closed is now in the public eye and open to all.

The religious world Jesus was born into tended to be very private and closed. First Century Judaism mostly meant that to find God, you pretty much had to be born into the right religion or convert to Judaism, but even if you did convert, you were not welcomed in the same way. In Luke's version of the Christmas story, (in chapter 2), it is extraordinary that it's shepherds, (of all people), to whom the angels sing. Shepherds were living examples of the irreligious, the "un-churched," if you will. The "shepherds keeping their flocks by night" business is so familiar to us that the ancient scandal of it flies right over our heads.

The Christmas story in Matthew's gospel, (also in chapter 2), tells us of "Magi" who were the first to welcome and glorify Christ at his birth with gifts. They were Gentiles, non-Jews, foreigners, representatives of all nations. The Magi and shepherds are pioneers of the diversity we have become as followers of Christ today. Those shepherds and Magi standing in our nativity scenes and pictured on our Christmas cards are silent reminders to us that narrowness is not the way it was meant to be according to the Gospel. Churches throughout our nation and time, if not diligent, can grow narrow and private and associations of the like-minded, racially homogenous disciples.

There was once plenty of room for the likes of shepherds and Magi. Northwood, like many churches, has an open and big table which unites us in Jesus Christ. A living example of the grace of God.

So, the truth we need to remember is that Epiphany is a celebration of the openness and the breadth of Christian faith. Epiphany is a public welcome to all, however strange to our eyes they may be. Epiphany is an invitation, addressed to all, to come to the table – shepherds and Magi, Republicans and Democrats, conservatives and liberals, illegal immigrants and refugees, Catholics and Protestants, firm believers and faith-strugglers. There's plenty of room. And this is a truth we need not forget in 2020 as we crown and proclaim Him Lord over all!

## Music Ministry's Annual Garage Sale




### Experiencing God Class
