Member Survey Update

Dear Members.

Following the suspension of in-person worship services in March of this year, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Session appointed a Commission comprising eight (8) Elders and Pastor Curvin to plan for resuming in-person worship. The Session also approved a set of policy guidelines which would provide the framework within which the planning would take place. The Commission decided to include in its activities a member survey with the objective of keeping our members engaged with the Church and also to encourage your participation and input in the planning process. The Commission prepared a brief survey questionnaire which was circulated electronically on the Church's website with printable copies available online and hard copies available in the September 2020 issue of "The Window." We appreciate so much your participation and responsiveness to this survey which resulted in the receipt of more than 100 responses with very relevant suggestions and comments, many of which are being incorporated in the Commission's planning.

After analysis of these responses, the resulting data indicated that 95% of our members plan to return to church although not all will come at the very start of in-person worship mainly due to health challenges and the unavailability of an effective vaccine. Further, a large majority of our members expressed appreciation and support for the measures which are being put in place to make returning to church as safe as possible. These include mandatory use of face masks, hand sanitizing and social distancing among others.

We appreciate your many expressions of support and encouragement for the Pastors, other Officers and the Church in general, for providing ongoing services such as live streaming of our worship services. We know that many of you are anxious to return to in-person worship with the interaction and fellowship to which we have grown accustomed. We all share that longing and look forward to the time when we can all get together. Thank you so much for sharing your thoughts and concerns with us and in the meantime, let us all be prayerful for one another and for God's guidance in all that we do.


