as we proclaim the mystery of faith.

Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again!

The pastor continues, recalling the names of the saints of Northwood who have died between November 1, 2015 and October 31, 2016. (Please see front cover.)

HYMN NOTES

Today, at communion, we will use portions of what is known as The Great Thanksgiving—that communion liturgy that has been used for centuries in the Christian church. Some portions have traditionally been sung, including the section known as the *Sanctus* (holy) which is rooted in a text from Isaiah 6:3 and echoed in Revelation 4:8. In the second half of the 20th century much of this rich and historic liturgy was recovered by mainline Protestant churches including Presbyterians. With emphasis on involving worshippers as participants as opposed to spectators, much singable and accessible music has been produced toward that goal. Our hymnal, *Glory to God*, has included many choices in this regard in the section headed “Service Music”, # 551-609. Today we will sing together a setting of the *Sanctus* to a familiar melody.
