

HYMN NOTES:

Today We All Are Called to Be Disciples (757)

By H. Kenn Carmichael (1908-1996)

This text—not so new anymore—was created to be part of the 1986 stewardship campaign of the Presbyterian Church (USA) which had the theme “Called to Be Disciples.” During the fall of 1986 it appeared on the back of denominational bulletins, and it was first published in *The Presbyterian Hymnal, 1990*. Carmichael eventually became an associate pastor in the Presbyterian Church (Central Presbyterian Church, Lafayette, Indiana. Much of his career was as the head of the theater department at Purdue University, and after serving in the Navy where he made training films, he joined a film production company producing films for denominational stewardship campaigns.

The tune, KINGSFOLD, is named for a village in Surrey where the arranger, Ralph Vaughan Williams first heard this traditional English melody. He included it in *The English Hymnal, 1906* coupled with the text “I Heard the Voice of Jesus Say” which we also sing from *Glory to God*. This tune is included four times in our hymnal. The closing voluntary today is also based on this melody.

11:00 A.M. Experiencing God Class in room 15 led by Vicki Krueger.

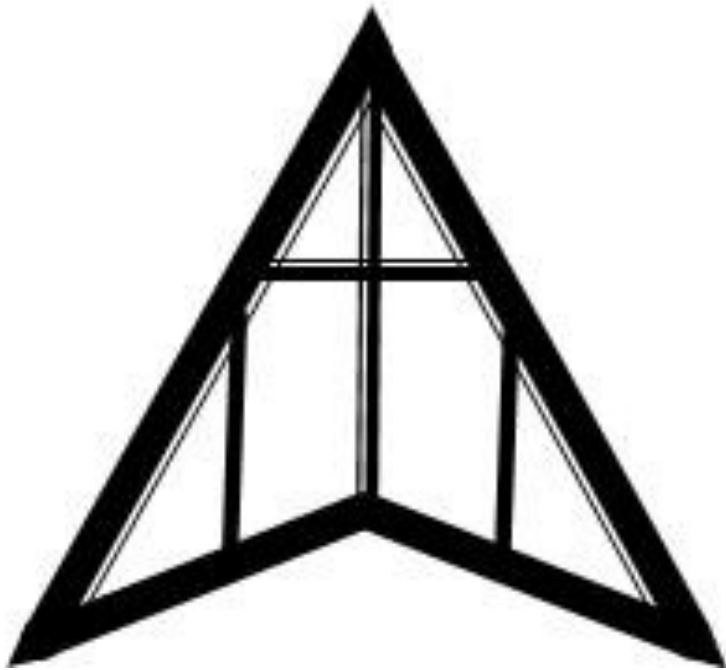
6:30-7:30 P.M. Bible Study in rooms 12 & 14
