It will take us a while to discover all the wonderful resources contained in the pages of the new hymnal, *Glory to God*. Take some time over the next few weeks/months to leaf through and make your own discoveries. The first 48 pages contain suggested Services of Worship and other texts used in worship, followed by 853 hymns (compared to just over 600 in the former hymnal). Also included are a number of indexes that sort the hymns according to scriptural references and topics—a help if planning a program, devotion, or worship service. In all, 1018 pages in the book! Our goal today is to give you a small sampling of some old favorites and a couple of brand new ones.
