New Paraments

Have you noticed the beautiful new paraments in the sanctuary? Paraments are ornamental cloths used in a worship space that serve as a symbolic proclamation of faith. The colors used in the paraments have meaning, too. Green is the color seen most often. It represents "Ordinary Time." It symbolizes our ongoing need for spiritual growth. White is used for days which require purity, respect or reverence. Flame Red is used to represent the Holy Spirit on Pentecost. We're currently in the time of Advent, which is symbolized by Purple. Purple is the liturgical color of preparation. Each of these is intended to provide a visual element to our worship space.
