Obituary of Joseph Zeigler

Joseph E. Zeigler passed away on December 26, 2020. He was 82 years old.

Joe was born September 28, 1938 in Charleston, West Virginia to Joseph E. Zeigler Sr. and Martha Jean (Cablsh) Zeigler. He was the older brother to Rev. John Zeigler of Denton, Texas.

He was survived by his loving wife of 38 years, Mary Ellen Zeigler. 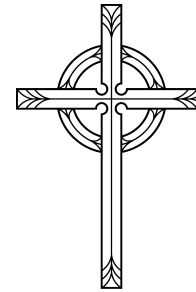
