

Forty-two people excitedly gathered in Edinburgh, Scotland for the start of a musical excursion that will long be remembered. Thirteen folks from Northwood joined with composer Joseph Martin on September 2 to see the sights of Scotland, Northern Ireland and The Republic of Ireland as well as sing and play in significant cathedrals there. We had a knowledgeable Irish guide as well as some specialists to tell about the John

Knox House in Edinburgh and the city of Derry.

The sense of history in these centuries-old buildings and cities is awesome. We sang in St. Giles Cathedral where John Knox

Ireland) was in the first cathedral built in the British Isles after the Reformation. Some of us heard the cathedral choir sing at Christ Cathedral in Dublin where Handel conducted the first performance of Messiah.

Some travelers arrived early and others took advantage of a three day extension to southern Ireland or took their own extended tour, but I think everyone would agree that it was a trip of a lifetime.
