Be sure to put this date on the calendar for next year's Women's Retreat: February 7th - 9th!! More info to follow at a later date!!



Honduras Mission Team A Brief Re-Cap

A dedicated group of adults and youth traveled to the beautiful mountains of Honduras to minister to people in need. Along with spending time in the mountains, the team did outreach work in the capital city of Tegucigalpa with the Marketplace Ministry and at the Government Hospital. Many of the people in Honduras have no idea that they are sick. The goal of the mission team was to perform women's exams, provide basic medical screenings and tests as well as dental work to diagnose issues and to teach the people about proper hygiene.

Along with performing medical screenings, the team painted local buildings and worked with the school children. They played sports, did crafts, sang songs, and watched movies about Jesus. The children look forward to the Americans coming every year because they get to do things that they don't normally get to in school. The people that play sports with the children used a tool called an evangucube to preach the gospel. Before the trip, the team collected personal care items, school kits and flip flops to distribute to the people in the villages.

The Foundation for International Missions, which is based out of St. Petersburg, Florida, supports the New Hope Clinic which is run by Dr. Cesar Davila. The country of Honduras is a beautiful place to travel and to do mission. The bunkhouse that the team called home for the week overlooks the mountains and surrounding fields.

This trip was a chance of a lifetime. Throughout the entire trip, God worked through the team to help reflect his love for all of his children and to share his word.


