Wi-Fi? Why Not?

According to Neilsen Research, 65% of all Americans owned a smart phone in 2013. Even if you dispute their research methodology, all you need to do is take notice when you're out and about. Everyone seems to have a smart phone in their hand, on their belt or at their ear. The more we come to rely on these devices and their data capabilities and the more we become accustomed to hopping on the free Wi-Fi at Starbucks, Publix, and even Michael's craft store, the more we come to expect it everywhere we go...maybe even at Northwood.

Some of you may not believe this, but people have been asking me for Wi-Fi passwords at the church for about four years. We do have Wi-Fi in the church office, but since that network is for church payroll and banking, that is not a password that we release. Furthermore, since Wi-Fi signal quality is largely a function of distance and the number of users, having the password doesn't do you much good unless you are sitting right in the office as the signal would be insufficient.

Why do people want Wi-Fi at the church? There are several answers. If a person has a smart phone, using Wi-Fi as opposed to a 3 or 4G Network from the service provider saves the user money. If a person has a laptop or tablet-type device, they cannot access the internet at all while on our campus. And if you're asking why someone coming to the church needs internet access anyway...that list gets longer every day.

Sunday School curriculum used to be supported by DVD's and audio tapes. More and more of those resources are made available to teachers/facilitators online via a laptop or monitor in the room. Vendors like those who were recently here for the Craft and Vendor Fair have a need for internet access to process payments electronically. Children in the Before/After School program need to access class and homework materials online. And while some of us may not be ready for it, others have expressed an interest in being able to access the Bible online during the worship

So, why don't we just put an unsecured wireless router in the Christian Education Building and call it good? The bottom line is that it simply won't work. Remember, signal quality is a function of distance and number of users. Unlike your home where you're always in range and maybe one or two of you are using the network, such a solution on our campus with multiple users across the campus would be like doing virtually nothing at all. All of this is to say that if you're wondering about Wi-Fi at Northwood, we're working on it and we realize the increasing need. If you are not interested in Wi-Fi and internet access at Northwood, just know that there are some very legitimate reasons to consider it and address the need.

To that end, we have met several times with the Director of Information Technology at a neighboring church that has successfully implemented Wi-Fi across a much larger campus than ours. I am in the process of getting bids for the inside wiring that is necessary for wireless. (Ironic, isn't it?) And we know the cost of the necessary hardware that will be placed strategically across the campus. Initially, it appears that it will be about a \$4,000 project with the potential to grow as demand is expected to increase. When the fact finding is complete, we will determine the next steps relative to the budget and in concert with the Stewardship/Property/Finance Ministry ~Chris Hurst. Business Administrator Team. I'll keep you posted!


2015 Pledge Campaign


