As many of you know each year I refer to our January church-wide garage sale as "the annual miracle." I say this because it is miraculous to me how so many people work together in this cause year after year to accomplish what it does. It is a modern miracle to see how so many un-needed items are transformed into treasure for our music ministry! This year our Deacons also contributed by providing nourishment to the many shoppers who not only shopped the sale but got to know us for hopefully further involvement with the church. The annual garage sale is only one of the many ministries here that illustrates how much can be accomplished in Christ's name when we work together.

All this reminds me that every January is a time to reflect upon what we should keep and what we should part with in life as people of faith. There are times when it's good to hang on to stuff, and times when it is right and better to "let go" of things.

How often counselors wish that they could convince clients to dump old regrets in the ocean of God's acceptance. There are some people who dwell on the lack of love they received at some point in life or carry anger over many years because the past cannot be undone. Remember, then, not to hold on to the sins of the past. If you do, they will try to destroy your happiness. Turn them over to God who promises to remember our sins - no more! So the garage sale, this annual miracle, can serve as a reminder at the beginning of each year for us to not only get rid of our stuff for the sale, but to throw our regrets away and hold on to the graciousness of God.

The garage sale also reminds me that it is time to give up time wasters and hold on tight to the powerful present. Time is so very precious and yet so many of us spend too many hours watching television or football (and yes I will watch the Super Bowl on February 2nd). We all do this at times. But when things are postponed and a golden opportunity is missed because of wasting time, then we may be living like the folks who talk about "killing time" or "marking time." Let's try not to live like that.

Perhaps someone reading this will think about finishing a degree, writing a book they always wanted to write, teaching a class, painting a picture, joining the photography club or the church choir, starting an active prayer life, working out physically, tithing your income or taking some chance for God. The point being... don't waste time. "This is the day the Lord has made!"

A man by the name of Dr. Hartsell Wilson wrote wisely, "This is the beginning of a new day. God has given me this day to use, as I will. I can waste it or use it for good, but what I do today is important, because I am exchanging a day of my life for it. When tomorrow comes, this day will be gone forever, leaving in its place something that I have traded for it. I want it to be a gain and not a loss; good and not evil; success and not failure; in order that I shall not regret the price I have paid for it."

Our church wide garage sale each January is a great time to remember to ask what we should discard and what we might hold on to. I encourage you to throw away old regrets and hold on tight to God's forgiveness; toss out anxieties about your future, hang on to your dreams; get rid of time wasting and throw your life around precious present moments of life.

Do you know what you will get if you do these things? You will get a life. A life transformed by the power of God's love is a life well worth living. And this can be not just an annual miracle but a miracle each and every day!

ARE YOU IN NEED OF AN EASY JOB?

We have a free and easy job for everyone who comes to Northwood. When you drink a can of soda or open a can of soup, or anything else that has a tab opening, please pull off the tab! Collect all the tabs you can and bring them to Northwood. There's a basket on the shelves by the south double doors where you can deposit them. Esther-Elizabeth Circle of PW collects all the tabs and delivers them to the Shriners in Tampa.

Shriners Hospitals for Children is a health system of 22 hospitals dedicated to providing specialized quality care to children up to the age of 18 with orthopedic conditions, spinal cord injuries, burns, cleft lips and palates, etc., regardless of the family's ability to pay. The Shriners use the money from the pop tabs to buy wheelchairs, other equipment, toys, books and craft supplies for the children.

It takes 1,400 tabs to make a pound! One time last year over 10 pounds were delivered from Northwood! Since 2002, Shriners Hospital for Children-Tampa has collected over 120,000 pounds, which is equivalent to over \$106, 500.00.

Please help us help the children! It only takes a minute to pull a tab and the children benefit far longer than it takes to pull tabs.

Please accept this job and thanks for your efforts.

It is with great pleasure I announce that Kid's Corner is the grateful recipient of a new classroom. We will be able to have a five day three-year-old program now, which has been requested for so many years. To that end I am looking for a Certified Teacher and a Classroom Assistant. The hours for the teacher are 8:30 A.M. to 1:00 P.M., with the occasional event and/or training which you are paid for. I am looking for someone with a B.A. degree in either Early Childhood Education or Elementary Education. Any degree in Education can be a possibility but additional classes would be necessary to learn how to adjust to working with younger children. The Classroom Assistant would need to be at least 21, with a high school diploma. Classes would need to be taken to meet the requirements for Pinellas County License Board. The Classroom Assistant's hours would be 8:30 A.M. to 12:30 or 1 P.M., depending on our needs, with the occasional event and/or training as well.
